

Peer-led training for people with learning disabilities



34 workshops delivered to people with learning disabilities on topics like health screenings, staying safe from scams, wellbeing, and money training

This year **46** professionals completed our easy read training course

All paid the real living wage






We distributed over £10,000 in emergency support through Household Support Programmes
